## ALL AGES STORY TELLING of the ants who herd the caterpillars

Have you heard the story of the ants that look after the caterpillars? The Butterflies who look for the ants? Come and hear the true story!

Long ago the Adelaide Plains were an open woodland tended to by the Kaurna people. Eucalypts spotted the grassland, kangaroo grass, shrubs and a myriad of creatures. Among them the Chequered Copper Butterfly and the black ants who tend to their wellbeing.

This live storytelling event shares the beautiful relationship between the ants and the butterfly and how the ants tend first to the eggs, then to the caterpillars. Herding them each day in and out of their own burrows under the *oxalis* plant where they rest together.



This story takes place within the bigger story of the Adelaide Plains.

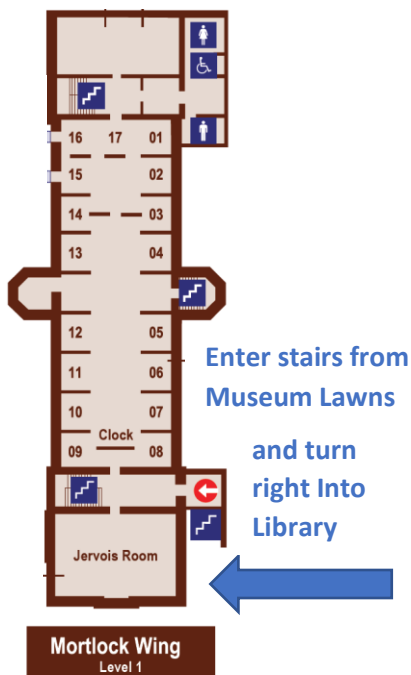
Come join us in the magnificent Mortlock Library to hear the lives storytelling in an intimate group.
